Writing:
 We start the term with exciting book week activities! After this, we will explore our key text 'Lost in the Toy Museum', where we will sequence the story, describe characters and settings before writing our own fictional stories based in a toy museum. We will then look at instructions, writing instructions on how to play a game.

Computing:
 We start with e-safety, learning about how to be safe and responsible online. We then look at using different skills - drawing, typing and recording data as part of a rocket topic.

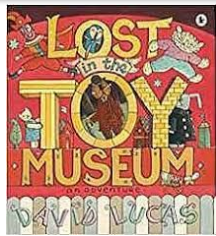
DT:
 In DT, we are going to make our own toy cars! We will look at how wheels work with an axle and explore this before fixing wheels so we understand how they work. We will then design, make and evaluate our own working toy cars to a design brief.

 In PE this term, the children will have Invasion Games on Monday and Forest School on a Wednesday afternoon.

Reading:
 Children will have daily Read Write Inc Phonics sessions. For children who are off the scheme, they will have guided sessions around a short novel and use of Lexia. We have daily story time and whole class guided reading, where we will be reading the 'Amelia Jane' series by Enid Blyton.

PSHE:
 This term, our theme is 'Healthy me'. We will look at making healthy food choices, being safe around medicines, being relaxed and how we can stay healthy.

RE:
 In RE this term, we are learning about Christianity. Our question is: *Why does Easter matter to Christians?*

Enrichment:
 This half-term, we have book week which will include lots of fun book-related activities! We will also visit the Church and complete Easter activities.

Mathematics:
 In Maths, we will focus on multiplication and division, looking at problem solving and fluency. We then look at fractions, time, money and shape and position. Please encourage time telling at home and exploring money at home in a practical way!

History:
 In History, our topic is toys over time! We will describe our favourite toys from today, before exploring what toys our adults played with in the past. We will then compare, contrast and sort toys based on their characteristics before learning about how technology has changed toys.

Music:
 Our music this half-term will be focused on the song 'Round and Round', a song written for the classroom by Joanna Mangona. It's style is Latin Bossa Nova.

Science:
 Our new topic in Science is 'Animals'. We will be classifying different types of animal, such as mammals, reptiles, amphibians, birds and fish and look at the similarities and differences between them. We will explore animals with backbones and look at what different animals eat, using the terms herbivores, omnivore and carnivore.
