Writing:
 We start the term with activities linked to our key text 'Lila and the Secret of Rain'. We will make predictions, write a setting description and use role play to reenact the story. We will then write our own fictional stories. We will then write weather diaries and keep a factual record of this. At the end of the term, we will write senses poems about Winter.

Computing:
 We start with e-safety, learning about how to be safe and responsible online. We then look at algorithms and how technology uses them.

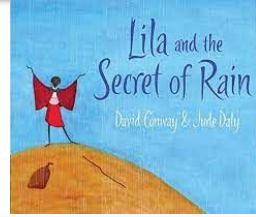
Art:
 In Art, we are going to create abstract paintings based on extreme weather and the work of Monet and Lissa Bockroth. We will learn about colour mixing, using different tools and techniques with paint before creating our own large scale abstract paintings.

Reading:
 Children will have daily Read Write Inc Phonics sessions. For children who are off the scheme, they will have guided sessions around a short novel and use of Lexia. We have daily story time and whole class guided reading.

Extreme Weather!



PSHE:
 This term, our theme is 'Dreams and Goals'. We will look at choosing realistic goals, how to achieve them, staying motivated, working collaboratively and perseverance.

RE:
 In RE this term, we are learning about Christianity. Our question is: *Who do Christians say made the world?*

Enrichment:
 This half-term, we are aiming to have guest speakers in to discuss the weather.

Mathematics:
 In Maths, we will focus on place value before exploring addition and subtraction. We will be using different written and mental methods to problem solving and reason. Our fluency facts are number bonds to 20 and the 5x table. At the end of term, we look at multiplication and division.

Geography:
 In Geography, we are naming the 5 oceans and 7 continents. We are learning about daily and seasonal weather patterns in the UK. We will then learn about climates around the world before completing case studies on a hot and cold country.

Music:
 Our music this half-term is learning about many different styles of music. The styles we will learn about are: Blues, Baroque, Latin, Bhangra, Folk and Funk.

Science:
 Our new topic in Science is 'Seasonal Changes'. We will name the 4 seasons of the UK and learn when they take place and the distinctive features of each season. We will notice similarities and differences between the seasons and notice changes to our local environment as we go through winter. We will also be conducting investigations about the weather, by making a simple weather station and recording the data. We will then look at each season in more detail.
